A WORD FROM OUR LEADERSHIP

My third year leading the talented and driven team at UWIRC was packed with exciting challenges, celebrating some big "wins," and plenty of learning opportunities as we worked relentlessly to achieve our objectives. I am excited to share some highlights and explore where UWIRC is headed next. The five bold goals steering us are: Advance Community Impact Strategy, Maximize and Diversify UWIRC Supporters to Build Enduring Relationships, Strengthen Our Infrastructure, Grow Revenue, and Strengthen Marketing and Communications.

Real, measurable change that impacts root causes and redirects future outcomes requires time, financial resources, and system coordination. UWIRC has aligned our strategic plan to identify activities that support the work that kind of change requires. While there are no quick fixes, by bringing people, resources, and strategies together, we can help people improve their lives and strengthen our community, a community we are all proud to be a part of.

One of our biggest accomplishments was launching Access to Justice, a unique public-private partnership with the Clerk of the Court. By establishing this initiative and delivering it as a direct service of United Way, we are firmly putting a stake in the ground as a problem solver and gap filler. The success of this program in its first year reflects our commitment to addressing a real need in our community and proactively developing a solution, rather than waiting for additional support to become available.

Partnerships like this demonstrate that through the power of combined efforts, we can reach more people and do more good. In fact, as we were running the numbers for this report, we noted that we are serving over 1:4 IRC residents. Just a few years ago, we reported that number at 1:6. Proof that as our community grows, shifts, and changes, UWIRC is staying vigilant about meeting the needs of our neighbors.

To engage a wider part of the community, we launched several exciting events and competitions that aimed to share our work and bring more neighbors to the United Way family. Wiffle Palooza, a Wiffleball Tournament, kicked off our year, and as March approached, we held a St. Paddle's Day Pickleball Tournament, we kept with tradition at our Citrus Golf Tournament in April, and then capped it all off with an exciting Trike Wars and Block Party in May. These events allowed us to engage with so many new

supporters and have fun! You'll see some recapped in the following pages but please look out for the 2024-25 dates to join us.

United Way continues to play a crucial role in addressing the most pressing issues by supporting a wide range of programs and initiatives. We remain uniquely positioned to understand community needs, identify disparities, and improve lives through direct service, collaborations, resources, volunteerism, and advocacy. 926 clients served since opening on Sept. 21, 2023 UWIRC is proud to have launched Access to Justice, an initiative aimed at providing vital legal services in IRC. This collaboration with the Clerk of the Court, court administration, county government, and local attorneys addresses the community's need for accessible legal support.

The initiative has established Self Help Centers at the IRC Courthouse and United Against Poverty, assisting self-represented litigants in various legal matters, including family law and small claims.

402 civil-related and 360 family-related client cases have been addressed. The centers also facilitated 158 attorney consultations. This unique partnership is made possible by funding from John's Island Community Service League, John's Island Foundation, Truist, The Kahle Foundation and Indian River Community Foundation. 
OUR FINANCIALS


