

IMPACT AT A GLANCE

We fuel brighter futures through education and support healthier families with access to care. We create pathways to prosperity while addressing urgent needs today for a better tomorrow. With 48 funded programs, evaluated by Citizens' Review Panelists to ensure measurable outcomes that support the ALICE population, United Way goes beyond grants by also providing direct services, building collaborations, and driving initiatives to address our community's most pressing needs and create lasting change.

This past year, 31,548 residents gained access to low-cost, nutritious food, 4,855 received dental care, 590 children enrolled in quality early learning, 1,278 youth attended after-school programs, 183 veterans had their basic needs met, 108 individuals received job training, and 1,752 neighbors turned to the Multi-Agency Resource Center, where 728 families received housing and utility assistance following Hurricane Milton that struck our community.


